CALL FOR PROPOSALS

The Accademia Nazionale dei Lincei announces a competition to award the International «Cataldo Agostinelli e Angiola Gili Agostinelli» Prize, of € 15.000 (amount before tax), awarded to an eminent scholar in the fields of Pure and Applied Mechanics or Mathematical Physics.

The Prize is awarded to an Italian or foreign scholar who has distinguished him/herself in the insurance field. Candidates may be proposed by the members of the two Classes of the Academy or may apply personally.

Members of the Academy may not compete for the Prize.

The Members of the Lincei and the Presidents of Italian and foreign Academies are invited to nominate individual Italian or foreign researchers.

The nominations must reach the Academy no later than **31<sup>st</sup> December 2010**.

Those wishing to compete should send by registered mail to the Secretariat of the Accademia Nazionale dei Lincei - Via della Lungara, 10 - 00165 Roma - within **31<sup>st</sup> December 2010** (date of postmark) the following:

- a) written application for admission to the competition, addressed to the President of the Academy;
- b) one copy of published works or manuscripts, preferably in electronic format (pdf). Manuscripts must be signed by the authors and be clearly legible;
- c) a brief report of scientific work;
- d) list of works submitted above (b) containing the title, publisher and year of publication of each work.

In his/her application the candidate must clearly indicate his/her personal data.

Applications or works carried out in the offices of the Academy will not be accepted.

Examination of the proposals and applications shall be carried out by an *ad hoc* Committee appointed by the appropriate Class during the month of January 2009.

The Committee will be composed of three members of the Academy.

Members of the Academy who have submitted proposals may not be members of the Committee.

In the absence of candidates the Committee shall not award the Prize.

The Committee must present to the Council of the Academy, no later than 31 May, a written report in which it must result that all the proposed candidates have been given proper consideration.

The Council will then submit the proposal, with their own opinions, to the judgement of the appropriate Class and successively to the decision of the whole Academy in a Plenary Session.

The Prize will be awarded during the closing ceremony of the academic year in June 2011.
