

#### Work Programmes Structure



### Funding Schemes – IP

- <u>Purpose</u>: Ambitious objective driven research with a 'programme approach'
- Target audience: Industry (incl. SMEs), research institutions. Universities – and in some cases potential end-users
- Typical duration: 36-60 months
- **Optimum consortium:** 10-20 participants

### Funding Schemes – STREP

- <u>Purpose</u>: Objective driven research more limited in scope than an IP
- <u>Target audience</u>: Industry incl. SMEs, research institutes, universities
- Typical duration: 18-36 months
- **Optimum consortium:** 6-15 participants



## Funding Schemes – NoE

- <u>Purpose</u>: Durable integration of participants' research activities
- <u>Target audience</u>: research institutions, universities, mainly indirectly: industry – through governing boards etc
- <u>Typical duration</u>: 48-60 months(but indefinite integration!)


• **Optimum consortium:** 6-12 participants

### Funding Schemes – CSA

- <u>Purpose</u>: Coordination of research activities and Support to programme implementation, preparation of future actions, dissemination of results
- <u>Target audience</u>: research institutions, universities, industry incl. SMEs
- <u>Typical duration</u>: 18-36 months (CA); 9-30 months (SSA)
- Optimum consortium: 13-26 participants (CA); 1-15 participants (SSA)



- Think Strategic Do not see it as a money making machine
- Have a Cool, New and Innovative Idea
- Have a Strong Profile
- Be Realistic
- Be Selective do not shoot anything that moves
- Be close to your business
- Set SMART Objectives

- Learn from Past Experiences especially others'
- Read ALL documents including guide for reviewers
- Raise Issues early (IP, delivery, financial capability)
- Progress to milestones
- Track resources
- Conduct regular audits
- Find the right project and right partner
- Submit Early and Often when using EPSS

- The network of NCPs is the main structure to provide guidance and practical information
- Personalised support during the project



#### National Contact Points

- Established and financed by Member States
- Networked to all other NCPs in Europe
- One NCP for each area of FP7

#### Role of the National Contact Point

- Offers a helpful and <u>FREE</u> service.
- Disseminates information on FP7.
- Maintains website and provide e-mail updates.
- Identifies opportunities for Malta in current calls.
- Organises info days and training workshops.
- Helps in finding the right EC funding and partner.



#### Role of the National Contact Point cont...

- Advises on joining consortia and proposal writing.
- Networks locally and abroad.
- Assists in partner searches.
- Offers one-to-one consultations & full confidentiality.
- Assistance of FP7 Documents and procedures
